Instructions for Formatting the Camera-Ready Version of Your Paper

1. Conference metadata

LaTeX users: using **ACM** *Alternate* **style** (Option #2 on http://www.acm.org/sigs/publications/proceedings-templates), specify the following configuration in your .tex file:

Template #1 is not allowed because it does not include permission block and copyright line.

Word users: in the ACM template, change your copyright notice in accordance to the following:

To copy otherwise, or republish, to post on servers or to redistribute to lists, requires prior specific permission and/or a fee.

2. Title

Use **title case**, i.e., capital letters for the first letter of the main words of your title. Example: "This is the Title of my Paper"

3. Authors

For each author, specify complete name, affiliation, address, and email.

4. Abstract

The abstract is **mandatory**.

5. Classification

Categories and Subject Descriptors

Please use the correct category and subject descriptors for your submission. The ACM Computing Classification Scheme: http://www.acm.org/class/1998/. Most MobiOpp papers will probably have at least one descriptor in category C.2.

After you have made the decision about all applicable nodes in the Computing Classification System, prepare the material in the following format:

Third-level node number [**Second-level node title**]: Third-level node title – *first subject descriptor, second subject descriptor, etc.*; Third-level node number...

As an example:

 $C.2.1 \ [\textbf{Computer-Communication Networks}]: \ Network \ Architecture \ and \ Design-\textit{Wireless Communication};$

In LaTeX the previous becomes:

\category{C.2.1}{Computer-Communication Networks}{Network Architecture and Design}[Wireless Communication]

General Terms

Your general terms must be **any of the following 16** designated terms: Algorithms, Management, Measurement, Documentation, Performance, Design, Economics, Reliability, Experimentation, Security, Human Factors, Standardization, Languages, Theory, Legal Aspects, Verification.

Keywords

Keywords describing the content of the paper. Keywords are *not* mandatory. Keywords must be separated by a comma.

6. Formatting guidelines

Strictly adhere to ACM guidelines for margin, text size, etc.

ACM GUIDELINES (http://www.acm.org/sigs/publications/proceedings-templates):

Page Size and Layout: All material on each page should fit within a rectangle of 18 X 23.5 cm (7" X 9.25"), centered on the page, beginning 1.9 cm (0.75") from the top of the page and ending with 2.54 cm (1") from the bottom. The right and left margins should be 1.9 cm (.75"). The text should be in two 8.45 cm (3.33") columns with a .83 cm (.33") gutter.

All body text is set in two columns. The two columns on the last page should be of (nearly) equal length.

Normal or Body Text: The body text is set in 9-point Times Roman (cmr). Use sans serif or nonproportional fonts only for special purposes, such as distinguishing source code text. Right margins should be justified, not ragged.

Title and Author Information: The title (Helvetica or Arial 18-point bold), authors' names (Helvetica or Arial 12point), author addresses, affiliations and phone number (Helvetica or Arial 10-point) and email address (Helvetica 12 point) run across the full width of the page. Up to three author names and information blocks may be aligned at the top of the first page; any additional author information appears in a paragraph at the end of the paper.

References and Citations: Footnotes should be Times New Roman 9-point. The format of references is a numbered list at the end of the article, ordered alphabetically by first author, and referenced by numbers in brackets e.g. [1].

References should be published materials accessible to the public. Internal technical reports may be cited only if they are easily accessible (i.e. you can give the address to obtain the report within your citation) and may be obtained by any reader. Proprietary information may not be cited. Private communications should be acknowledged, not referenced (e.g. "[Robertson, personal communication]").

Page Numbering, Headers and Footers: Do not include headers or footers in your submission

Hierarchical Section Headings: The heading of a section should be in Times New Roman 12 point bold in all-capitals flush left. Sections and subsequent subsections should be numbered and flush left.

The heading of subsections should be in Times New Roman 12 point bold with only the initial letters capitalized. (Note: For subsections and subsubsections, a word like *the* or *a* is not capitalized unless it is the first word of the header.)

The heading for subsubsections (or lower) should be in Times New Roman 11-point italic with initial letters capitalized.

ACM guidelines are by default satisfied when using ACM templates provided at http://www.acm.org/sigs/publications/proceedings-templates. We strongly recommend you to use these templates for producing the camera-ready version of your paper.

In addition to ACM requirements, please consider also the following:

- Last line of a paragraph at the top of a column is not allowed.
- Section and sub-section headers should remain with at least 2 lines of body text when near the end of a page or column (no WIDOW).
- [Word users only] Columns on last page should be made as close as possible to equal length.

Instructions for Generating Your Final PDF File

- The page size MUST be US Letter (8-1/2x11 inches).
- File MUST be **PDF.**
 - Only PDF versions >= 1.4 are allowed
 - o Each file must have *thumbnails* and be optimized for *fast web viewing*.
- File MUST have all **Type 1 or True Type fonts** (Type 3 NOT allowed).
- All fonts MUST be embedded within the PDF file
